

# Message from the Mayor

I am very honoured to have been chosen as Mayor of St Austell for the 2011/12 civic year and would like to take this opportunity to thank everybody who has supported me in this role.

The Town Council has achieved and supported many things during this year. In the summer of 2011, the Town Council entered St Austell into the South West in Bloom competition where it won a silver gilt award. As a first time entry we were delighted with this achievement - just one step away from the prestigious gold! We did not achieve City Status, but we took the



opportunity to submit a bid to raise the profile of the town and let everybody know that St Austell has a lot to offer. Our profile has definitely been raised and our aspirations to become the "Green Capital of Cornwall" and an up market tourist area are beginning to show signs of reality.

In June 2011 St Austell hosted Armed Forces Day, a successful day bringing people into the town from far afield. On the 19th May 2012 we shall host the passage through our town of the Olympic Torch, a once in a lifetime experience, when the eyes of the world will, for a short moment in time, be focused on St Austell.

As the Mayor I have had the honour of presenting cheques to various organisations who



have successfully obtained money from our grants budget. The Boxing Club, Bowls Club. Cricket Club and Football Club have all received grants during my year. The House at Polkyth through funding from the Town Council is now able to stay open on a Friday night for young people of the town. Both financially and with support from the Councillors we have seen other events continue successfully. The Torchlight Carnival is now an established annual event and the Christmas Tree competition and voucher scheme both trialled in the Town last Christmas were so well received it is quite possible that they too will become annual events.

We continue to work in partnership with Newquay Town Council with the retaining and monitoring of the CCTV in both towns. The clearing and cleaning of the River Walk from Truro Road to Pondu Road is nearing completion making it a safe and pleasant walk way for all to enjoy.

We have improved one of the important gateways into the town at the bottom of South Street, negotiating with the owner of the land to enable us to take on the wonderful improvements there.

I took great pleasure in opening our new Town Museum, situated in the old cells at the Market House. This has not only been a significant addition to the town, attracting young and old alike, but it has raised the footfall and profile of the Market House itself.

We are the newest Town Council in Cornwall and are very proud of what we have achieved so far. We have a good team of Councillors, and with help from the community, we will continue to give St Austell the support that it needs to enable it to maintain its upward journey.

#### **St Austell Town Council**

St Austell Town Council was formed in June 2009 and has 20 elected Councillors (4 Councillors representing the Gover Ward, 4 Councillors representing Poltair Ward, 2 Councillors representing St Austell Bay Ward, 5 representing Bethel Ward and 5 representing Mount Charles Ward). A list of current Councillors is included on page 15 of this report.

The next Town Council elections will be held in 2013.

Each year, the Council elects one councillor to be the Mayor who then acts as the civic leader and chairs Council meetings. The Council has a Code of Conduct and is committed to sound corporate governance arrangements.

Meetings are held in Cornwall Council's One Stop Shop at Penwinnick Road, St Austell. The full Council meets approximately every six weeks. In addition to the full Council meetings, the Council has three standing committees to ensure the effective management of its business:

- Finance and General Purposes
- Planning
- Communities

There is a public participation session at each of the Council's official meetings which enables members of the public to make comments or raise issues about items on the agenda. From time to time, working groups



are formed to address particular issues. A calendar of Council meetings for the forthcoming year can be found on the Council's website at www.staustelltowncouncil.com and at the back of this report. Agendas and minutes are published on the website.

The Council employs two full-time and one part-time members of staff who are based at the St Austell One Stop Shop, Penwinnick Road, St Austell, PL25 5DR. These are:

The Town Council serves the Town of St Austell which has a population of approximately 22,000. Services and facilities provided within the town of St Austell are also enjoyed by people living in the surrounding villages and by the many tourists who visit the town each year. St Austell has been identified as an area which is capable of significant economic and residential growth. The Town Council is very keen to ensure that this growth is managed properly and that appropriate infrastructure accompanies it. St Austell area is one of four areas chosen by central Government for the development of Eco Communities and this is likely to bring with it many challenges but also many opportunities to improve infrastructure, economic wellbeing and quality of life in the area.

As a recently formed local Council, the Town Council currently manages very few services. It has mainly a representative and lobbying role to ensure that local views are taken into account by the larger organisations operating in the area.

The Town Council is consulted on all planning applications in its area and in relation to many of the other services provided by Cornwall Council.

The Town Council is keen to work in partnership with Cornwall Council and other agencies in order to ensure delivery of the highest quality services and facilities to local residents.

#### **2011/12 Activities**

#### Marie Curie Field of Hope

In 2010/11, Town Council staff and Councillors organised the creation of a Field of Hope on the grass verge between Holmbush and Charlestown Roads in conjunction with Marie Curie. 5000 bulbs were obtained and planted by volunteers at no cost. In 2011/12 a bench was installed using funding from Cornwall in Bloom to create a small oasis of tranquillity near these busy roads.



#### **Town Centre**

The Town Council helped with the funding and organisation of Christmas lights and Christmas late night shopping entertainment. It has been actively involved with a major refurbishment scheme for Fore Street and Aylmer Place which will cost in the region of £1.3 million and will be completed in June 2012. Work is progressing in conjunction with this scheme on information signs for the various gateways to the town centre and improved signage throughout the town.



A conservation area appraisal is being organised partly funded by the Town Council to ensure that the historical buildings in the town are preserved and properly maintained. In partnership with Cornwall Council, Cornwall College and the Chamber of Commerce a Shopmobility Scheme, Go St Austell, has opened and has recently taken over the old Oxfam book shop to help ensure its ongoing viability.

Work has progressed on the creation of a Business Improvement District possibly based on the town centre area and councillors and traders have combined to bid for Government funding to help promote the town centre through initiatives linked to the Portas Report on town centre shopping.



#### **Armistice Day**

The Town Council, working closely with the Royal British Legion, organised the Town's Armistice Day parade and procession in 2011. The Mayor and Town Councillors participated in this well respected, high profile annual event.

#### South West in Bloom

The Council entered St Austell in the South West in Bloom competition in 2011 for the first time in many years and councillors assisted by Serco's horticultural staff worked hard to make sure that St Austell looked at its best during judging. They were rewarded for their efforts with a silver gilt award which was an excellent achievement for a first time entry. A team of volunteers from the local community and councillors are taking forward the initiative and hope to build on the success of 2011.



#### City Bid

Although St Austell was not granted City Status, the benefit of producing the bid has been invaluable.

The City Bid process has raised awareness of what our Town has to offer to local people, visitors, developers and



businesses looking to invest in the area. It has raised aspirations as to what we could become in the future, it has set down strong foundations on which to build future success and, most importantly, it has brought our community spirit to the fore.

#### Carnival

The Council continued its funding and support for the torchlight carnival which was in its third year after a break of 10 years. This was once again a tremendous success and our special thanks go to those who helped to organise and took part in the event.

#### Other initiatives

The Town Council has:

- Secured a contract for CCTV camera monitoring in partnership with Newquay Town Council and Cornwall Council to help maintain CCTV services in our town centres;
- Operated a small grants scheme for local community and charitable groups;
- Obtained grant funding and worked with Cornwall Council to clear and tidy the area around River Walk in order to make it safer and reduce anti social behaviour in the area;
- Applied for grant funding and started work on a Town Plan to help steer the work of the Council and other bodies in and around St Austell;
- Undertook pre-planning consultations with a number of developers, arranged a number of large scale public meetings to give residents the opportunity to raise concerns and suggest improvements to major planning proposals;
- Responded to consultations affecting the town on many issues including car parking, cycle ways, speed limits, public conveniences and bus shelters;
- Worked closely with local businesses to strengthen their representation and input to local issues;
- Submitted a bid to Cornwall Council to have a new state of the art archive and record centre for Cornwall built in St Austell and have been short-listed as one of the preferred locations;
- Headed up the St Austell Olympic Torch Steering Committee which oversaw the Olympic Torch celebration events in the town



#### **Cornwall Armed Forces Day**

The Council applied for grant funding and organised the Cornwall Armed Forces Day held in St Austell on the 25th June 2011. This prestigious event was hugely successful, attracted hundreds of military personnel and veterans to the town and provided an opportunity for the public to show their appreciation to the armed forces for all that they do.

#### Attendance at Meetings

Overall, Councillors attended over 82% of the meetings they were scheduled to attend. Councillors Lake and Walker attended 100% of the meetings which they were scheduled to attend. Councillors Derry and Palmer attended the most meetings (31 each).
